Welcome back to another school year and a special welcome to our families new to Mantua! We opened this year with 894 students, a slight decrease in total numbers from last year. The major decreases are in the Deaf/ HOH program and in the GT Center program.

During the summer, some changes around the building are making a significant difference in the safe flow of students. We now have two cafeteria lines, which has significantly reduced the amount of time students are taking to get through the lunch line. The new cafeteria tables that arrived last Spring and the schedule that has one grade level or family at a time in the cafeteria has significantly reduced the noise level and made the cafeteria feel roomier! Feel free to join your child for lunch and enjoy the new and improved Mantua cafeteria!

In the front of the building, you may have noticed our new double sidewalk that allows students to more safely exit at the end of the school day. Behind our school building, we had two of our oldest trailers removed and received a quad (four classroom structure) that this year is housing our fifth grade students.

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### **Counselor's Corner**

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It has been really great seeing your children again for the 2003-2004 school year! We welcome our new students and families to Mantua! Teresa McConnel (K-3) and Rebecca Jones (4-6) will be joined this semester by Shira Brothers, our counseling intern from George Washington University. We are all here to help and support students and families for the best year possible. Besides monthly guidance lessons in each classroom, the counselors frequently meet students for fun, informal lunches. Individual and small group counseling is available with parental consent. Please let us know if you think your child could benefit by working on some of the following issues: social and friendship skills; anger and stress management; study skills; changing family situations. The counselors are available to meet with parents/guardians about your concerns about your children.

Each year, the counselors and the PTA offer parent education workshops for our families. This year we are also offering a 6 session course called "Active Parenting." This series of classes uses videos and a parent handbook to explore many important aspects of communication and discipline for families. **Read Naturally** New to our reading program this year is school-wide use of the Read Naturally materials to improve students' reading fluency. Correlated with fluency is improvement in comprehension which, of course, is the heart of reading. Thanks to the PTA, three complete sets of the materials, walkmen tape players, and timers to implement this program have been purchased. To use Read Naturally students are timed reading orally for one minute to determine a fluency rate. Then, on their own, they practice reading while listening to a tape. This practice improves their fluency, as they will see when they time themselves again on the same passage and graph their progress. Comprehension questions follow the oral reading. Over a six to eight week period of time we expect to see students' fluency and comprehension go up and up! Classroom teachers, the reading specialist, the ESOL teachers, and the special ed teachers will all use this program with students they think need the extra practice to improve their reading.

**Congratulations to Sixth Grade Summer Readers!** During the first week of school eleven of our sixth graders turned in completed summer reading bingo cards. For their efforts they were awarded a five dollar gift certificate to Borders Books funded by the PTA. Their challenge was to read enough books, magazines, and newspapers to fill in all twenty-four spaces on their bingo cards during the summer. In addition, nineteen other students turned in cards showing they had also done a lot of summer reading. They received bookmarks or pens for their efforts.
