# -Treasurer's Report

### Fundraisers

- We received \$28.52 from Terracycle for a collection sent to them to recycle Put this in "Donations" since I didn't have an account suitable. If we need to create a new account, let me know. It is likely that it's left from two students who carried out the program last year
- Flippin' Pizza Restaurant Night was successful and we received a check for \$369.00
- We sent a 50% down payment in the amount of \$1678.12 to Fun Events to lock in our Spring Fling/Carnival rental equipment
- We paid a reimbursement to cover the cost of the pizza party for the fundraising goal winning class

# Programs & Events

- MathCounts registration fees were collected in the amount of \$241 and we paid for their T-shirt order in the amount of \$261.60
- Under Basketball Expenses, we paid the FCPS Community Use fees for the upcoming April 15<sup>th</sup> game at Woodson (PTA basketball game is planned with parent-staff mixed teams) and we paid for this year's trophies
- Chat 'n' Chew and Drama Club each had \$30 deducted as reimbursement for the discount of registering their kids with those clubs as a PTA member (6 total members @ \$10 each)
- Drama Club Ticket Sales were deposited in the amount of \$2528.00 for Annie, Jr.

- Classroom Language Art check for \$2000 was given to Mantua Elementary School
- Under Community Spirit Activities, we are paying Everything Entertainment \$450 to DJ this Friday's Valentine's Dance
- Parent Education Expenses include \$250 as the 50% balance due for the Celebrate Calm seminars that will be rescheduled and \$493.90 for the Active Parenting DVDs that were purchased for the PTA's Parent Resource Library

#### Supplies

- \$50 was reimbursed to Mrs. Dini as she paid for the Winter Concert's pianist to accompany the performances out of her own pocket. We may need to create a new "Account" for this type of expense moving forward
- Custodial fees for basketball are still being negotiated for our unique program. Previously they have agreed to subsidized fees. Ms. Fernandez agreed to speak on behalf of PTA Basketball. Bob Greene commented about fees charged to community groups for use of school grounds/facilities on evenings and weekends

- Our head custodian, Odair Morales' last day is tomorrow
- FCPS School Board met and voted not to apply for the waiver to start school early in fall 2016. School start date will not change in 2016 but may change starting in 2017-18. If school starts earlier, school would end earlier in June
- Reminder regarding Kiss and Ride rules: For those of you who use Kiss and Ride at the end of the school day, you may have noticed that dismissal is taking longer than usual. This delay is resulting in students who ride buses getting home significantly later than usual. Please remember that buses are scheduled to be at Mantua by 4:00 p.m. Due to the volume of cars, they are stuck in the Kiss and Ride line and not able to get to the bus loop on time.

For afternoon dismissal, we are asking parents **to not arrive in the Kiss and Ride line UNTIL AFTER 4:05 p.m.** Currently, Kiss and Ride traffic on Kirkwood is already blocking the entrance to Horner Court by 3:45 p.m., and buses are not able to pull in the bus loop to load bus riders.

Our hope is that by having buses arrive a few minutes earlier and delaying the time Kiss and Ride cars block Kirkwood, we can have dismissal completed faster for everyone while maintaining a safe environment for all. This can only be accomplished with your cooperation.

In addition, please remember that **students should not be dropped off at Mantua before 9:00 a.m**. Thank you in advance for your help!

Update on the Reflections program from Karen Cheng: two students are moving onto the district level; awards for county level winners will be presented on 4/1 at FCHS. We already have four volunteers for next year's program; the theme will be "What is Your Story?"

#### V. New Business

Jan-Marie Fernandez: The school will be closed to any activities this summer because of grounds maintenance. Contractors will be replacing heating and a/c units on roof of building, hoping for improvement of the system and cut down on work orders placed for maintenance. Mantua is rated an Energy Star School

Storm water project is back on but they are working on better management of the school grounds – i.e. underground tanks instead of drainage ponds and restoration of the ground above grade, new plan is less invasive to the use of school grounds (i.e., playground, fields and blacktop), trying to improve the current ponds, School Board member Dalia Palchik is involved

Also the neighborhood Crooked Creek project is working in conjunction with the storm water project

Hope to incorporate learning opportunities associated with the stream restoration and storm water projects. Already Mrs. Sullivan's class is involved in a bird watching project, doing research on bird habitat and environmental impacts

Nick Rousos' father is very ill with stage 4 cancer and has now had a significant stroke. Mr. Rousos will be out of the building often during this difficult time so please copy Ms. Fernandez and Ms. Alley on any communication to him.
