Mantua ES Parent FAQs

What is Open House/Back to School?

Open House/Back to School is a combined event (except for Kindergarten) held the day before school begins. Class lists will be posted, and children and parents will have an opportunity to meet teachers and visit classrooms. Please see the following document for more information.

What are “Families” of classes?

From Kindergarten through second grade, students are placed into one of four families (Family 1- 4). Each family has one or two classes of Kindergartners, 1st graders, and 2nd graders. All four families are supported by Mantua’s specialists (Reading, Learning Disabilities, ESOL, and Technology) and teachers within each family work together. For certain units of instruction teachers may choose to use “flexible grouping” to allow students to work at different paces for certain units. In this case, your child may have a different teacher from within the family for that unit. In addition to enabling the teachers to meet a wider range of student needs, the families also provide a comforting “small-school feel” for our younger students. Students in grades 3-6 are not assigned to families.

Will Kindergartners remain in their classroom most of the day?

Most of the day your child will remain in their classroom with their primary teacher; however, they will travel throughout the school for recess, lunch, PE and “specials” like music, art and computers.

Will my Kindergartner receive help getting to the classroom and to the bus/kiss and ride?

Each Kindergartner is given a name tag with his/her bus number and teacher’s name in an effort to help manage this process. A 6th-grade “School Patrol” is assigned to each Kindergartner and knows the bus and class information for each child in his/her group. The patrols will help guide their students on and off school buses and to the classrooms. Faculty are also actively involved in the process to ensure all children are cared for and delivered safely to their buses and classrooms. Patrols will also take those children being picked up at Kiss and Ride from their classroom to the Kiss and Ride station to wait for you. ***If your child is going to be taking the bus as their mode of transportation, you should absolutely have them take the bus from the first day of school. ***

What is a Tuesday Folder?

A Tuesday Folder is your child’s personal “mail pouch” for things that need to go to and from home, such as permission slips and money for class activities, flyers for PTA and club activities, etc. Teachers may also choose to send homework or completed work home in the folder. The folder is a large white envelope which will be sent home each Tuesday. You should review the contents, sign the folder and return it to class the next day with any returning forms or notes to the teacher.

What is an SOL?

The Virginia Standards of Learning (SOLs) are state-mandated standardized tests taken every year in May and June starting in third grade. For more information, visit <http://www.doe.virginia.gov/testing/index.shtml>

What is the AAP Program?

Mantua has a full-time Advanced Academics Program center for grades 3-6. Students are tested in the fall of 2nd grade for possible placement in the AAP Center. What is the “Blackboard 24-7” online tool?

FCPS enables extended learning beyond the traditional school day and school facilities by using a tool called FCPS 24-7 Learning, or “Blackboard”. Beginning in 3rd grade, students, parents and teachers are invited to use Blackboard to access assignments, view class calendars, explore links to enrichment activities, and much more. What is Mantua’s music program for grades 3-6?

Beginning in 3rd grade, all students learn to play the recorder. In the 4th grade, students may also elect to play a string instrument in the orchestra. In 5th grade, students have the option to choose from a band or orchestra instrument, and also to join the chorus. A student may join the orchestra OR band and also the chorus if they chose. Each has both a fall and spring concert. Every student takes general music education classes, whether or not they choose to participate in orchestra, band or chorus. Information about these programs will come home with your student from the music teachers.

What types of before/after school activities are available?

Before/after school clubs include Scouting, Book Club, Kids Care Club, Drama Club, Raccoon Runners and various Academic Teams. The Mantua PTA Basketball League is open to grades 3-6 and is coached entirely by Mantua parents!

Mantua also offers the Global Plus world language program, and extensive enrichment opportunities, with categories focusing on many areas of interest including art, music, STEM and sports.
