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WELCOME BACK STUDENTS!!

The cafeteria staff looks forward to serving many wonderful lunches this year. Please be sure to check the Breakfast and Lunch menu in your child's Tuesday folder at the beginning of each month.

Also, as a reminder, lunch cards are available for each student. This is an easy way for students to pay for lunch. Cards are kept in the cafeteria accessible to the students. Just send in a check (any amount) to your child's teacher (made payable to Mantua Cafeteria) and credit will be added to your child's account. The card works just like a debit card so it is important to keep a balance sufficient for your child to purchase lunch. When the account gets low, your child will receive a sticker or a hand stamp as a reminder more money is needed in the account. It's a great system and works well.
