I am pleased to report that the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the School Board's proposed sale of the Pohick land with some of the proceeds going to accelerate the completion of the Woodson High School renovation. Following the BOS vote, the School Board voted to sell the land back to the developer in accordance with the land deed's reverter clause. The School Board is now negotiating the sale price.

I received over 60 cc emails sent by parents to the supervisors supporting the sale and advocating for renovation of our students' high school. I was informed by our electeds that we were heard and well received. Thank you, thank you very much.
