#### Got Kids? Get Involved!

Welcome to new parents and welcome back to the returning Mantuan parents. Summer vacation seemed to fly by and we find ourselves starting another school year. For parents of newly attending students, the Mantua Elementary School Parent-Teacher Association extends a warm "Welcome Aboard" and an open invitation to join us as we strive to maintain and improve our efforts to aid the teachers and administrators in providing quality education opportunities to our students. As for the veteran parents, it is good to see you back, especially those who have found the time to participate in the school's activities and share with their children through volunteerism at the school.

Just as our students bring their diversity of individual skills and talents to enable them to master a new grade, new challenges await the parents as well, and these challenges may only be met with the combined efforts of the parents. Much is still to be done, so let's look at four simple opportunities:

<u>First, stay in touch.</u> With our children, we are jointly responsible for knowing and staying on top of student assignments and activities. For your assistance, the PTA provides information through seven avenues of dissemination:

- Mantua PTA Newsletter that you are reading is a quarterly public ation that addresses upcoming events;
- Mantua PTA website (www.mantuapta.org) presents the calendar and information about upcoming events and PTA-supported activities, and provides valuable links to other websites;
- **Alert News** is a weekly news bulletin sent via your student's Tuesday folder or electronically to your email address;
- Mantua PTA Handbook, distributed to new families and upon request to returning families, is an updated resource that provides answers to many practical questions and identifies contacts for inquiries;
  - Flyers are periodically sent home via your student's Tuesday folder;
- PTA meetings normally held the first Wednesday evening of every month in the school library are open to all to attend; and
- PTA board members may be contacted by telephone or email to answer questions regarding our activities.

Second, Join the PTA. We are just like you; you *should* be one of us. We share the same anxieties that you have as your children go out the door, get on the bus and enter the school to face their learning community of books, tests, lunches and recess. It wasn't too long ago that you were one of them, and it is that background that we collectively bring to the PTA to advocate for superior education opportunities and an enriched scholastic environment for our students.
