## DRAFT Notes of the Mantua PTA June 1, 2005 Mantua Elementary School

The president called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m. Present at the meeting were:

Executive Board: John Jennison, Cheryl May, and Nancy Robinson.

**School Representatives:** Jan-Marie Fernandez, Tina Tingler, Cheryl Thompson, and Janet Sottolano.

**Board Members:** *Lauren Brandman, Jennifer Cooper, Donna Yudkin, Beth Whitehead, Maragarita Brown, and Patti Pratuch.* 

General Membership: Melinda Burroughs, Rene Pana-Cryan, and Donna McGrath.

Nancy Robinson made a **motion** that the minutes of the May 4, 2005 meeting be approved. Donna Yudkin seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Cheryl May distributed the Income Statement for the eleven months ending May 31, 2005. She noted that we finished the year better than we projected, with a balance of \$24,000 in the checking account. Because of the additional income, she made some recommendations for next year's budget:

- Cheryl May made a **motion** to increase the Mentor Works program budget to \$375 to cover end of year expenses. Melinda Burroughs seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- Cheryl May also made a **motion** to encumber the \$4,600 made by this year's Basketball program to fund next year's program. Donna McGrath seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- Cheryl Thompson noted that we didn't do anything for the custodians during Custodial Week. Cheryl May responded that the \$450 in the custodial fund was not used. Beth Whitehead made a **motion** to expend \$450 on the custodians in a manner the principals deem appropriate. Melinda Burroughs seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- Cheryl May made a **motion** to encumber \$620 for next year's budget for the After School/ASL program. Donna McGrath seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- Cheryl May made a motion to encumber funds to next year's Math Happenings program. However, questions were raised about what funding was exactly needed, so the motion was dropped. Cheryl will meet with Randi Kirkland to understand better what she needs.

The agenda was interrupted to allow for the following **New Business** presentations:

- John McAdams discussed his proposed Boy Scout Eagle project in which he plans to clear out the thorn bushes along the playground back fence and plant hedge rows instead. He said this plan eliminates possible injury to students and may also stop students from teasing the horses on the other side of the fence. He is asking for \$500 to \$600 to cover the cost of the plants.
- Jimmy Saterfield discussed his proposed Boy Scout Eagle project in which he plans clean out dead bushes and plant new plants and rose bushes around the flagpole at the front of the building. He is asking for \$200 to cover the cost of the plants.

Beth Whitehead made a **motion** to increase the landscaping and beautification budget expense to \$2,000 to cover these landscaping projects. Lauren Brandman seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Cheryl Thompson remarked that they would like someone to work on raising the profile of the front of the school with additional landscaping and beautification as we get so many visitors to the school. John Jennison noted that a landscaping committee may need to be formed to help with these issues.

John Jennison made the following announcements:

- The annual MCA Parade and Picnic is being held on June 4. Cheryl Thompson will be DJ at this event.
- The PTA newsletter deadline is this week.

Mrs. Fernandez made the **Principals' Report**:

- SOL testing finished today. Preliminary results on the 5<sup>th</sup> grade writing test show outstanding results.
- Cheryl Thompson was nominated for the Outstanding Support Service award. There will be a reception on June 9.
- The Volunteer Appreciation Tea will be on June 13. Childcare will be available.
- June 24 is the last day of school with early release. June 23 is the 6<sup>th</sup> grade party.
- Governor Mark Warner will visit the school on June 16 to present the Governor's Gold Award for Physical Fitness and Nutrition. School Board member Phil Niedzielski-Eichner will present the award to the PTA. John Jennison and Rob Mead will accept the award on behalf of the PTA. This award recognizes the 35<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the basketball program, as well as our overall physical education program and lunchroom nutrition program.
- The 3<sup>rd</sup> grade team has been receiving professional development on compacted math. This program targets teaching two grades of math in one year.
- On June 26 Jan-Marie will begin a fellowship in Italy with five other principals with Italian foreign language programs in their schools. For 12 days, the principals will live and breathe Italian language, culture, and food.
