Mathematics Standards Implementation for 2011-12 SY

The new 2009 Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) mathematics standards will be fully implemented in the 2011-12 school year. With the implementation of the new standards, Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) is aligning the new Elementary Mathematics Instructional Sequence (EMIS) with these standards. EMIS will allow all students to access the advanced mathematics curriculum either in an advanced mathematics classroom or in a general education classroom through differentiation. The new instructional sequence provides teachers with the tools

needed for differentiation. EMIS offers multiple entry points for students to access the advanced mathematics curriculum when they have developed the cognitive skills to be successful. Advanced mathematics extended indicators and above grade level correlated standards will be available for students as early as kindergarten and will build a stronger foundation in mathematics.

The compacted mathematics curriculum is being enriched and expanded to include extensions that allow students to develop critical thinking skills and develop a deeper understanding of mathematics that will better prepare them for upper level mathematics in high school and beyond. The current learning gaps that exist in compacted mathematics, created by selecting only certain standards, are being closed allowing students access to all standards. Compacted mathematics will become Advanced Mathematics to be more representative of the rigor in the program. The Advanced Mathematics curriculum will be available in all elementary schools including Advanced Academic Center schools. Go HERE for a voice over PowerPoint.

Standards of Learning (SOL) Assessments Information

Mantua students will be taking all Standards of Learning (SOL) Assessments online this year. Students will take the same tests as their peers throughout the state, however, rather then looking at a test booklet and bubbling their answers on a scan sheet, students will read and answer their tests on the computer. Middle and high school students have successfully participated in online testing for several years. Last school year, Mantua's 6th grade students took the U.S. History SOL online. All elementary schools will be required to participate in online testing by 2012.

This is a great opportunity for our students to gain experience taking tests online. FCPS is providing additional support and training to the elementary schools administering the SOLs this year. Due to computer availability, we can only test one subject per school day. Please make every effort to avoid any appointments or activities that would take your child out of school on test days.
