These are handheld devices for each student in the classroom that allows them to choose a response for multiple-choice questions, respond to a Yes/No question etc. This device allows teachers to check for understanding on any concept with each individual student without other students knowing their results. The additional funds were used to purchase four document cameras for those teachers who still needed this tool. These were wonderful gifts to assist teaching and learning!
