Expansion of AAP Centers: Meeting on November 29th

The Advanced Academic Placement Task Force, which began its work in the spring, is recommending that the number of AAP Level IV centers increase so that each FCPS pyramid has a center. Currently, six pyramids are without an AAP center,

requiring students to travel out of their pyramid-and sometimes to a different cluster-to receive these services. The Task Force recommends establishing new AAP centers in the Annandale, Edison, Falls Church, Marshall, South County, and Robinson pyramids. It is also recommending that the 15 FCPS middle schools without an AAP Level IV center should establish one.

Parents, principals, staff members, and citizens are being asked to provide input about whether their schools might be ready for these changes during the 2013–14 school year or if the changes should be deferred to the 2014–15 school year.

Considerations include space availability, facility readiness, teacher training, quality of the new program, timing, and community readiness.

The impact on Mantua would be the loss of our feeder schools from the Falls Church pyramid. We would be sharing the Woodson Pyramid elementary schools with Canterbury Woods' AAP Center. Therefore, both of our Centers would be reduced in size. The community information meeting for our cluster will be held at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, November 29th, in the Kilmer Middle School cafeteria. Mantua's FIRST LEGO League Team Wins Champion's Award!

Team Creationeers, comprised of six Mantua students and a student from Poe Middle School, earned the **Overall Champion's Award** and the **First Place Award** for Robot Performance at the regional FIRST LEGO League tournament on Saturday, November 10th held at Woodrow Wilson High School in Washington, DC.

For the past two months, sixth graders Todd Tran, Sarah Tadlock, and Amartya Banerjee, fifth grader Catherine Tadlock, and fourth graders Danielle Joseph and Nicole Joseph worked to create a multi-purpose LEGO robot and programmed it to solve various missions to earn points. Additionally, they did research for this year's topic, "Senior Solutions," which addressed the needs of senior citizens and developed an invention to present to judges.

Team Creationeers and their robot have advanced to compete at the state tournament to be held at James Madison University the weekend of December 8th-9th.

SchoolQuest gives you and your children a place to keep track of awards, volunteer hours, extracurricular activities and job experience. As you and your family move around the world and across the country, <u>SchoolQuest</u> stays in one place keeping track of all the information you choose to enter. This is a great way to keep up with all the activities a student will want to share on a resume, job application or scholarship essay. Information can be entered for any child in grades K-12. In addition to the logging feature there are articles about report cards, college planning, behavior problems, and much more. Here is how it works: Go to <u>SchoolQuest.org</u> and select "My SchoolQuest Profile". A student can choose to set up their own account which only they can use or if you have several children you can sign up as a Parent and log all your kids' information under one account so you only have to remember one password. Registering and using the site is absolutely free. School Quest is committed to students in educational transition.
