Jan-Marie Fernandez introduced Dalia Palchik, our school board representative and Mantua alumni. Ms. Palchik provided a budget update. Thankfully, after fearing a multi-million dollar deficit, with community support FCPS was able to get an improved transfer from Fairfax County. Programs were saved and teacher wages were addressed. The board was able to find funds from other sources to fully fund the budget. They estimate to have some savings for next year. May 19th is the next work session for budget; goals include continue to fund teacher pay increases for 2018, board of supervisors to look at additional restaurant tax to help fund schools and county resources.

Teacher Salary Update – goal is to get FCPS teacher salaries matching the local average pay rates, this budget makes progress; 12-17 years' experience bracket gets the best increase as the board tried to even out where there were the biggest gaps. Pleased with the progress and hope to see it continue

Assistant Principal Nick Rousos commented on the ripple effects of money being transferred around within FCPS, for example there were cuts to cafeteria and food service but school now pays for additional forks and napkins

SOL Test Dates:

May 17 – 5th Grade Reading SOL

May 18 – 4th Grade Reading SOL

May 19 – 3rd Grade Reading SOL part 1

May 20 – 3rd Grade Reading SOL part 2

May 24 – 4th Grade Math SOL

May 25 – 5th Grade Math SOL

May 27 – 6th Grade Reading SOL

May 31 – 5th Grade Science SOL

June 1 – 3rd Grade Math SOL

June 3 – 6th Grade Math SOL

June 7 - 4th Grade VA Studies SOL

- Students who will take a different grade level test, will take their appropriate test on the date listed for their grade level, ie all 5th graders will take their Math SOL on the same day regardless of if they take the 5th or 6th grade test
- Make up tests will be given after 6/7, please notify school of absences; do not send in sick children to take a test
- Letters were sent home regarding electronic device policy: Devices must be off and in a back pack so as not to create any disruptions; county policy states that a child must exit the test if a device is found and it be immediately determined if it's accidental or if cheating is suspected
- Third and sixth grade math tests are CAT (computer adaptive test) meaning the test responds to child's responses; more accurate results with less questions but cannot review answers
- Expedited retake option for students who fail SOLs with scores of 375-399; targeted remediation by teachers done before retake
- Retakes are scheduled based on a variety of factors, cannot be determined ahead of time
- Italian writing and speaking tests 3rd grade and 6th grade (computer lab speaking with computer, score recordings, basic exposure) begin next week but there are no conflicts with SOLs
