Input from Parents in Regards to the 2017–2018 Class Placements

Dear Parents,

First, let me explain the classroom placement process at Mantua Elementary. Our K-5 classroom teachers fill out cards with detailed information on each student in their classroom. We then meet with each grade level or Family and the teachers are involved in the initial class placement decisions. During the summer, Mr. Rousos and I work many hours to finalize class placement decisions. Therefore, please do not feel that it is critical for you to send me an email.

Next year, we are making some changes to our K-2 Families. Due to the increased rigor required in our second grade curriculum, our two multi-age teachers have chosen not to continue to teach multi-age this coming year. Ms. Morrison will be teaching first grade next year and Ms. Loveday will be teaching second grade. In addition, we are in the process of moving to four Families, with a Kindergarten, First Grade and Second Grade teacher in each of the four Families. We are hopeful that these changes will allow more students to stay in their same K-2 Family for their primary years. If you would like to share specific information regarding your child's placement needs for next year please send an email to <u>jmfernandez@fcps.edu</u>. It is useful to write a letter if your child has specific learning needs that were recently identified, you feel that your child would benefit from a specific teaching style, or needs to be placed apart from a particular student. Parent requests for specific teachers can throw off the dynamics of this process and cause a classroom to be filled with too many students with similar needs, therefore it is not

helpful to state the desire to have a specific teacher. Please understand that we take all parent input into consideration but cannot guarantee that we can fill all requests due to the need to build balanced classes that meet the social and academic needs of your children. If you do feel the need to share information, please remember that I must receive this email by **Friday**, **June 30th**. Have a lovely summer, Jan-Marie Fernandez Principal

Eco Tips

It's June, almost the end of the school year, and time to start thinking of the end of year parties! When planning your classroom party, please consider incorporating at least two or more of the following tips. This will help protect the environment and save some \$'s along the way:

> • Ask kids to bring their own reusable water bottles. Plastic water bottles are expensive, require a large amount of resources to produce and transport, and the plastic can leach harmful chemicals in the water.

There are lots of reusable bottles on the market today to reflect your child's personality! -Stick to finger foods! Cut up fruit, chips, crackers and cheese. Avoid using plastic utensils which will never degrade in landfills. For something sweet, consider minicupcakes, popsicles or cookies.

• Please don't use any Styrofoam products, which contain styrene which can cause adverse health effects. Styrofoam is lightweight and floats, so over time a great deal of it has accumulated along coasts and waterway and become a large component of marine debris. -If you need plates, buy small compostable and biodegradable ones. You can find them on Amazon, and also earn \$'s for the school.

• For activities, consider an outdoor event or using recyclable materials for craft projects. Forgo plastic tablecloths and decorations, the kids will have fun either way! Minimize the amount of trash produced it will make set-up and clean-up afterwards much easier!

Our hardy volunteers dug, hoed, tilled, wheelbarrowed, weeded, mulched, and did what was needed to create a fertile, welcoming spot for the new native seedlings. Many thanks for your hard work! Gardens Wish List If you have extra garden supplies at home that you would like to contribute, we can put them to good use during recess as our student gardeners have fun helping out in the Mantua gardens. We would be grateful to receive the following items to help maintain our new garden: -

• 3 to 4 large "log chunks" (to sit on) – like the log piece that is already there, which the kids love to sit and jump on.

• 2 used trellises – we plan to grow honeysuckle and wisteria in the garden spot next to the building.

• 2 large sturdy ole' watering cans (plastic or metal)

• Trowels – looking for 5 to 6 used hand trowels for the kids (metal or plastic).

• Gardening gloves – looking for 7 to 8 pairs of gloves (kid- or adult-sized).

We will be looking for volunteers to water the courtyard pollinator garden (typically during the summer "building open" hours of 9am to 3pm, Mon to Fri) and the bioretention basin garden and schoolyard habitat near SACC (both of which are outside the school). Also, if you are interested in volunteering to manage the Summer Watering Schedule, that would be fantastic. Please contact Ms. Sullivan at <u>masullivan@fcps.edu</u>. You would be contacting the families the day before their turn and also trying to fill in spots where no one had yet signed up. I anticipate that watering will be needed 2 to 3 times per week, for 8 weeks. (For week 9, Ms. Sullivan will be back on school grounds and will hydrate the gardens.)
