 - Tips on GMM and Alert News

 - Ms. Sullivan's class is involved; the PTA Board received a letter from her class asking for grants from four teams interested in surplus food donation, recycling, solar panels and a garden. Fundraisers

• Just over \$100 in donations received from MemberPlanet deposits since the last meeting

The Fairfax Ice Arena sent us a check for \$100 – Currently have this listed under the Restaurant Nights account because unsure where to put this money. PTA usually doesn't receive money from the Ice Skating event. It is a Community Spirit Activity; therefore we usually just pay out expenses and don't receive money from them. Will move the credit under donations.

Membership Dues

- We received 3 new memberships (\$38.08), which includes a discounted teacher rate
- We sent our 2nd payment to the Virginia PTA to cover state and national dues for 6 new members (\$22.50) since our first payment in December 2016

Programs & Events

- The Spring Break Art Camp has successfully filled all 32 spots. There are a couple students waitlisted at the moment. The total brought in is \$3652.00, but I will be refunding a couple parents that overpaid as soon as I get confirmation from Ms. Shirley after she has spoken with the parents. Therefore, the total will be closer to \$3624.00. Per Ms. Shirley, the PTA will receive \$960 of this (\$30 per student registered) and then the rest will be given to the art teachers to pay for supplies and their time.
- The Garden & Landscaping is coming along. We've reimbursed them for signs, paints, bird seed, flowers, plants book, lawn bags, mulch for a total of \$198.34
- Community Spirit Activities \$400 to the DJ for the Valentine's Dance, \$31.71 on snacks for the Ice Skating night, and \$275 for the Lego Night
- Drama Club \$3200 for *Charlie & the Chocolate Factory* from DramaWorks and \$357.00 for the T-shirts order

- Regarding the opening of Horner Court, JMF emphasizes that it was not initiated by the school; community members and concerned parents initiated the conversation with Dalia Palchik, who then came to the administration with facilities' plan already in motion; not aware that all residents were not involved. Many different solutions were discussed on this emotional issue but getting the kids in and out of the building safely is the one and only priority.

Testing news:

- WIDA is done, scores to be received in summer
- IOWA scores for 6th grade AAP and advance math students will go in the mail today
- Next week, first graders will take the Naglieri test, a timed 30 minute test for nonverbal abilities; test is taken on computers
- Finalizing SOL schedules for 3rd-6th grades; new this year, every child will take the Math SOLS in the CAT form (computer adaptive format, test responds to how kids answer). Hardest adjustment is that the kids can't go back to do a question again but gives a more accurate score
- Reading SOLS for 3rd, 4th, 5th grades are also CAT; new for these grades. Advantage that there are fewer questions so shouldn't take as long to complete the tests

• Question regarding adaptive questions: can students get back up to the higher level questions? Yes, they can, in response. Tests with questions randomized for difficulty can also be challenging for kids to handle; if they struggle on a series of higher level questions they may be tired or frustrated and not recover when they get to an easier question. Unit tests during the year are more helpful information to identify what areas kids struggle.

-Assistant Principal

- Working with engineers to help design brackets and fences to keep kids off building, can see evidence of where the kids are getting onto the roof, security cameras are not a viable option
- We have won 19 carts for \$500 from an online auction; \$20K worth of carts for \$800 including gas and transportation
- Bullying protocols in place for how to handle reports of bullying. Protocols differ based on if reports come in from kids or from parents, may require counseling and/or discipline based on the Bullying and Harassment Management System. Make a distinction between true bullying and unkind, inappropriate social behaviors; don't use the word bullying too lightly as there are big consequences to students' permanent records. Bullying is a big deal and taken very seriously. Discussed possible parent education session around the distinction between bullying and non-social skills, counseling and disciplinary actions. Additional bill being considered to deal with parent notification in cases of founded bullying
